Two years ago she went to a Mass that was conducted by Father Rookey at a shrine in Madugorie in former Yugoslavia.

She says the priest handed her a crucilly, laid his hands on her head and asked: "Do you want to walk."

When Heather said "Yes" he told her: "In the name of Jesus, stand up and walk."

He said: "Please don't call me a saint. I am just the instrument of Jesus. It is Jesus who cures through me.
